### ***Eligibility and Selection Criteria***

The Awards will be presented to a person or group who through research or practice has advanced the prevention and control of vaccine-preventable diseases at the population level within New Zealand. The recipient(s) will:

- be citizens or permanent residents of NZ.
- have an outstanding track record in immunisation or vaccine-preventable disease control, or
  - is an emerging researcher in immunisation or vaccine-preventable disease
- have undertaken a substantial part of his or her work in New Zealand.

Nominees must be actively engaged in at least one of the following activities:

- Research about immunisation, vaccines or vaccine preventable diseases that makes a contribution to the health of a significant population group and/or the knowledge about vaccines and vaccine-preventable diseases;
- Advocacy for the adoption of policies or programmes relevant to immunisation affecting the health of a significant population group;
- Implementation of a programme that has had significant impact on immunisation coverage or awareness, or providing an implementation model for others to follow;
- Health promotion relating to immunisation and vaccine preventable diseases.
